Report on Vigilance Awareness Week 2025

18th August 2025 to 17th November 2025

In line with the directives issued by the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC), the **Vigilance Awareness Campaign 2025** was observed by the **Directorate General of Lighthouses and Lightships (DGLL)** from **18th August 2025 to 17th November 2025**. The theme for this year's observance was:

KEY ACTIVITIES AND INITIATIVES

1) Inauguration and Oath-Taking Ceremony

The Vigilance Awareness Week, 2025 commenced with an oath-taking ceremony on **27th October 2025** at DGLL HQ, Noida and all the other 09 regional Directorates. All officers, staff, and outsourced employees took the Integrity Pledge, committing to uphold transparency, accountability, and honesty in every aspect of their professional and personal lives. The oath was followed by an address from the Director General, who emphasized the significance of integrity in the workplace and its role in combating corruption.

4) CAPACITY BUILDING
